Introductory Remarks by Chair Cetina

Chair Cetina announced for the record that this meeting was conducted by teleconference pursuant to the Brown Act waivers provided for under the Governor's Executive Orders in response to the COVID-19 State of Emergency. Further, the agenda stated that there was no public location for attending this meeting in person. The agenda stated that the public may listen and provide comment telephonically by calling the number listed on the agenda. Chair Cetina took a roll call of Committee members and staff present on the call as listed above.

I. Legislative Conference Call

- Michael Boccadoro and Beth Olhasso of West Coast Advisors (WCA) provided an update on state legislation, regulations, and policy items.
- The California Legislature is in the final three weeks of a two-year legislative session, which ends August 31. There will be no Climate Resilience Bond on the November ballot. The State's budget philosophy of "Budget and Hope" is in danger if the Federal stimulus is not enacted. Lastly, it is not expected that many bills will go to the Governor this year. Governor Newsom has 30 days after the end of the regular session to sign or veto bills.
- SB 1386 (Moorlach, Fire Hydrants), AB 1672 (Bloom, Wet Wipe Labeling), and AB 2560 (Quirk, Notification Levels) are bills that would affect CVWD and are now in Committee.
- AB 3030 (Kalra, Resource Conservation) is very vague legislation with the goal to protect at least 30% of the state's land areas, water, and oceans by 2030. ACWA and CSDA are actively opposing this bill. The Committee requested that staff mail letters of opposition and schedule phone calls with legislative representatives. In addition, the Committee requested that the District sign the coalition letters opposing this legislation.
- Mr. Boccadoro and Ms. Olhasso exited the call at 3:40 p.m.
